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AIM AND COMMON OBJECTIVES**Aim**

The overall aim is to focus on the important aspect of civil-military co-operation in a Peace Keeping Operation. Furthermore to promote mutual understanding and co-operation between forces from the Baltic and Nordic Countries in Joint Combined Peace Support Operations. The exercise will focus on the activities in the field and at sea.

Common objectives

- Enhance the co-operation between Inter Governmental Organisations (IGO), Governmental Organisations (GO), Non Governmental Organisations (NGO) and military forces.
- Combined Joint exercise planning, training, transportation and conduct of operations.
- Command, control, co-ordination and communications.
- To exercise and develop inter-operability and common procedures.
- To train, develop and execute medical evacuation (MEDEVAC) operations.
- Mine awareness.
- Media handling.
- Understanding of conflict, Rules of Engagement (ROE) and negotiation techniques.

CIVIL OBJECTIVES

- Assistance in negotiations with involved parties.
- Co-operation with civilian and military organisations.
- Humanitarian relief and handling of Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) and refugees.
- Release of Prisoners of War (POW).
- Exchange of dead bodies.
- Dealing with hijacking and hostage situations.
- Dealing with infrastructural problems.

LAND OBJECTIVES

- To exercise the formation, integration, deployment and employment of a multinational ground force in Peace Support Operations, including:
 - Co-operation with other military units, Inter Governmental Organisations, Non Governmental Organisations and Governmental Organisations.
 - Force Protection.
 - The set-up of Observation Post Temporary (OPT) and Mobile Check-Points (MCP).
 - Monitor and maintain a Zone of Separation (ZOS).
 - Execution of Observation Post (OP) and Check Points (CP) / Crossing Points duties.
 - Monitor Human Rights.
 - Exercise Rules of Engagement (ROE).
 - Escorting.
 - Patrolling.
 - Movement control.
 - MEDEVAC transport.
 - Mine clearing for special units.

MARITIME OBJECTIVES

- To exercise the formation, integration, deployment and employment of a multinational maritime force in Peace Support Operations including:
 - Co-operation with other military units, Inter Governmental Organisations, Non Governmental Organisations and Governmental Organisations.
 - Force Protection.
 - Maritime traffic control.
 - Conduct of embargo situations
 - Mine Counter Measure Operations.
 - Amphibious support.
 - MEDEVAC transport.
 - Search And Rescue (SAR).
 - Monitor and maintain the Zone of Separation.
 - Exercise Rules of Engagement (ROE).

AIR UNITS OBJECTIVES**a) all units**

- support a combined joint force, GO's, IGO and NGO's in a Peace Support Operation with airlift including cargo and passengers.

b) Heavy Transport Squadron

- MEDEVAC transport,
- airdrop

c) Lithuanian Transport Squadron

- MEDEVAC transport,
- supply airdrop

d) UNMIB MF Squadron

- observation and reporting troop movements in Zone of Separation,
- reconnaissance flights in area of crisis,
- helicopter transport of heavy supplies (sling load),
- helicopter rescue from dangerous areas,
- maritime helicopter rescue,
- maritime radar reconnaissance

e) CAA and Base OPS

- air operation support of a combined joint force, GO's, IGO and NGO's in an Peace Support Operation,

f) CSU

- sorting and preparation of casualties for fixed wing transportation.
