1 The training period will be conducted as station-based training. Focus will be on the main aim/objectives for the LIVEX. After the training the companies shall have broad knowledge in English communication, UNMIB mandate, rules of engagement (ROE), international law and of the most common used terms in Peace Support Operations.

2 During the training period the focus will be at individual- and section level. There will in addition be arranged some lectures on officers level and for the medical personnel.

CHECK POINT/MOBILE CHECK POINTAim

The aim is to give the soldiers, NCO's and officers such knowledge, understanding and attitude that they are capable to establish a MCP and on CP and on MCP in accordance with the UN Nordic Tactical Manual.

Objectives

- 1 The soldiers, NCO's and Officers will be given the knowledge of the equipment, weapons and personnel needed to establish and run a MCP and a CP.
- 2 The soldiers, NCO's and Officers will be able to conduct the working procedures/daily routines at the MCP/CP, like:
 - a. How to establish a MCP.
 - b. The control of personnel and vehicles and negotiating with the parties on the lowest level.
 - c. Confiscation of weapons, ammunition and explosives i.a.w. ROE.
 - d. Handling of:
 - Refugees/IDP's local casualties
 - Political demonstrations
 - Penetration attempts
 - Hijacking

OBSERVATION POST/OBSERVATION POST TEMPORARYAim

The aim is to give the soldiers, NCO's and Officers such knowledge, understanding and attitude that they are capable to establish an OPT, and to man an OP and on OPT in accordance with the UN Nordic Tactical Manual.

Objectives

- 1 The soldiers, NCO's and Officers will be able to observe and report:
 - Movement of troops,
 - Live firing,
 - Overflights and
 - Other activities, within the AOR
- 2 The soldiers, NCOs and Officers will be able to show force in certain situations i.a.w. ROE.
- 3 The soldiers, NCOs and Officers will be able to react properly to close firing.
- 4 The soldiers, NCOs and Officers will know the principles for the establishing of an OPT.

PATROLAim

The aim is to give the soldiers, NCO's and officers such knowledge, understanding and attitude that they are capable to conduct patrols in accordance with the UN Nordic Tactical Manual.

Objectives

1 The NCO's and officers will be given the knowledge and train on how to plan, conduct and lead a patrol while the soldiers will be given the knowledge and train to be a patrol-member. Among other things:

- Purpose/aim
- Patrol orders/briefing
- Equipment and manning
- Debriefing and reporting
- Observation techniques and ROE
- Readiness
- Drills when a suspicious object is found
- Convoy-Escort

ESCORTINGAim

The aim is to give the soldiers, NCO's and officers such knowledge, understanding and attitude that they are capable to conduct escort in accordance with the UN Nordic Tactical Manual.

Objectives

1 The NCO's and officers will be given the knowledge and training how to plan, conduct and lead an escort, while the soldiers will be given the knowledge and train how to be a member of the escorting unit.

2 At all levels:

- Purpose
- Organisation/Tasks (VIP's, NGO's and Supply)
- Observation
- Behaviour
- ROE

3 For commanders:

- Orders/briefing
- Distance between vehicles
- Radio procedures
- Reaction upon different situations/threats (ROE)
- Reporting/debriefing

MEDICAL EVACUATION (MEDEVAC)

Aim

The aim is to give the soldiers, NCO's and officers sufficient knowledge of all the routines concerning medical evacuation, and be able to lead and fulfil a medical evacuation under various operational conditions.

Objectives

- 1 All personnel will act according to correct and rapid procedures, whenever MEDEVAC is needed.
- 2 Understand how the unit is organising and carry out MEDEVAC in mined terrain.
- 3 Understand how to organise and carry out MEDEVAC after a traffic accident with multiple wounds.
- 4 Know the basic rules how to handle HELIVAC, including safety, signals and capacity.
- 5 Prepare the casualties for transportation by helicopter and ambulance.
- 6 Drill the load of casualties on stretchers into helicopters and ambulance.
- 7 Demonstrate and familiarise all personnel with the chain of evacuation, including equipment and capacity.
- 8 Safety-brief by helicopter-crew.

NEGOTIATIONAim

The aim is to give the soldiers, NCOs and Officers such knowledge, understanding and attitude that they are capable to negotiate with the parties on lowest level.

Objectives

- 1 Understand the principle and the basic rules of negotiation in a UN Peace-Keeping Operation.
- 2 The use of interpreters.
- 3 Give knowledge about planning process, performance and evaluation of the negotiation.

EXERCISE DIRECTIVES LAND COMPONENT

INSTRUCTORS / UMPIRES

Instructors from SWEDINT, GO's and NGO's will be used the first week at Almnäs.

MARKING OF UNITS

Military personnel (with the exception of some Role Players) shall always wear uniform during the exercise. UNMIB Force will wear camouflage uniform (national uniform). North Betaland Force will wear grey uniform (SE/m/58) and south Betaland Force will wear green uniform (SE/m/59).

UNMIB vehicles will be marked in front and rear. Convoys will have an additional light blue flag in front of convoy.

North Betaland vehicles will be marked with a black "N".

South Betaland vehicles will be marked with a black "S".
