

SECURITY

1) Security matters are to be handled along the guidelines given in the following agreement concerning PfP participation:

- a) Agreement among the states parties to the North Atlantic Treaty and the other states participating in the Partnership for Peace regarding the status of their forces.
- b) Additional protocol to the Agreement among the states parties to the North Atlantic Treaty and the other states Participating in the Partnership for peace regarding the status of their forces.
- c) Agreement between the parties to the North Atlantic Treaty regarding the status of their forces.

The documents mentioned above are available at the Swedish Armed Forces HQ, J 5 NP-98 and at CJC, J 2 NP-98.

2) NP 98 Security assessments

There is no known substantial threat against the NP-98 exercise. Any change in this assessment will be disseminated immediately.

With none or little warning, threat or disturbances may occur from

- criminals trying to get hold of weapons and ammunitions
- demonstrations carried out by groups opposing military exercises or environment disturbances etc.

3) Co-ordination of security

Security matters are handled within the J 2-section (in the joint staff).

Security forces

- Local garrison guard
- MP-units assigned to NP-98 exercise
- Swedish police forces

4) Weapon storage and transport security

When weapons are not in use they will be stored or guarded according to Swedish law and regulations. Exceptions may be given by the Force Commander or The CINC Central Joint Command or The Swedish Armed Forces HQ.

At the garrison of Almnäs and Visby special safety boxes will be provided to each company or platoon by HNS.

- a) Handguns, light machine guns, ammunition and other "easily carried away" weapons must be stored in these safety boxes when not used in training use.
- b) Heavy machine guns, vehicle mounted machine guns etc must have the vital part taken away and stored in a safety box.
- c) Military vehicles used in NP 98, when at garrison, will park at a guarded (24 h a day) parking place.
- d) The assigned safety boxes will be guarded 24 hrs a day and the keys to the safety boxes will be handled as agreed on.
- e) In the exercise areas, area surveillance and mobile security will be carried out by MP or local police authorities.
- f) During transportation from the Swedish border to the exercise areas and back to the border a specially assigned liaison officer, one MP-patrol and local police authorities will provide border crossing-, transport-, traffic- and security support.

5) Security problems report

Discovered, assisted or otherwise given threat or disturbances shall be reported as soon as possible to:

- UNMIB MF J 2
- to the nearest MP or civilian police officer or
- to any Swedish officer.
